

Guardrail Safety Training NOFO Q&As

Question 1: Under task 2 (Section A.6.2.a), is the technical assistance review of agency standards limited to guardrail related standards or does it go beyond guardrail?

The review of agency standards is limited to roadside barrier systems to include; standard sections of barriers, barrier terminals, transitions, bridge rails, and crash cushions.

Question 2: Under task 3 (Section A.6.3.a.iii), what is the expected timeframe for hosting training support materials on recipient's websites?

It is expected that training support materials would be hosted on recipient's websites until the methodology is obsolete or another suitable host is found.

Question 3: Under task 3 (Section A.6.3.a.ii), is the second bullet point describing the interactive tool for generic installations limited to guardrail, or should it encompass more types of longitudinal barriers?

It is expected that the interactive tool would be limited to strong post W-beam guardrail barriers.

Question 4: Under task 3 (Section A.6.3.a.ii), there may be some sensitivity or hesitancy about producing tools for proprietary devices. Can this be done for only non-proprietary devices?

This can be limited to generic non-proprietary devices.

Question 5: Under task 3 (Section A.6.3.c.i-v), it describes producing a PowerPoint slide. Is the intent to have the products on a single slide or multiple slides?

Either. Multiple slides or a single slide is acceptable, depending on the complexity.

Question 6: Under task 4 (Section A.6.4.a.i), is the intent to present about the latest products and research related to roadside safety hardware in general or keep it focused on guardrail specifically?

The intent is to focus on roadside safety hardware in general.
