Expanded direct conflict mitigation and trauma activities, and civil society support to peace process.

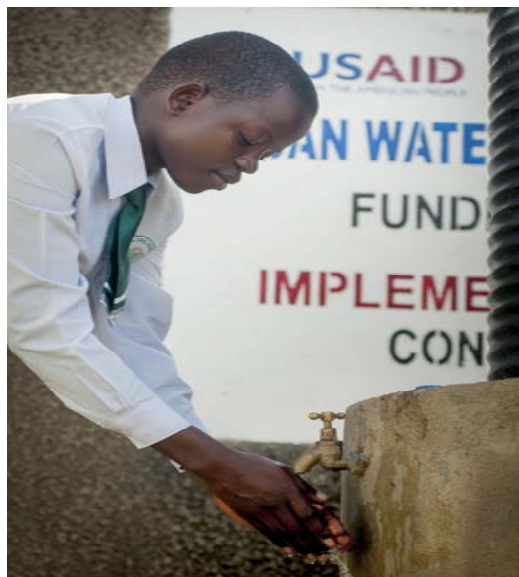

Problems to Address

Conflict-strained relationships and eroded coping mechanisms result in complex development challenges.

New models for assistance

Multi-sectoral and/or more flexible, conflict-sensitive mechanisms that can adjust to the emergency and recovery context.



Trauma & Reconciliation

Integrate explicit trauma-informed approaches.
