



OVC FY 2021 Invited to Apply – Enhanced Collaborative Model Task Forces Human Trafficking Training and Technical Assistance

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Overview

The [U.S. Department of Justice](#) (DOJ), [Office of Justice Programs](#) (OJP), [Office for Victims of Crime](#) (OVC) is seeking applications for funding the Enhanced Collaborative Model Task Forces Human Trafficking Training and Technical Assistance Program. This program furthers the Department's mission by assisting agencies to develop effective multidisciplinary strategies that combat and prosecute human trafficking.

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Program Description

Overview

This solicitation purpose is to select a set of coordinated training and technical assistance (TTA) providers to deliver a wide range of TTA services to local, state, and tribal jurisdictions, service providers receiving funding under the Enhanced Collaborative Model (ECM) Task Force to Combat Human Trafficking Program, 1 and others as identified by OJP. TTA providers funded under this solicitation are expected to work in collaboration with other OJP-funded TTA programs that offer a range of services to support both crime victims and victim service providers

Statutory Authority: This project is authorized by 34 U.S.C. §20705.

Specific Information

This training and technical assistance program will support jurisdictions to:

- Investigate and prosecute acts of severe forms of trafficking in persons and related offenses that occur, in whole or in part, within the territorial jurisdiction of the United States.
- Train law enforcement personnel how to identify victims of severe forms of trafficking in persons and related offenses.
- Educate and train law enforcement personnel in how to establish trust of persons subjected to trafficking and encourage cooperation with prosecution efforts.

Goals, Objectives, Deliverables, and Timeline

OJP seeks TTA providers that will provide coordinated delivery of national resources, subject matter expertise, and training critical to improving the capacity of state, local, and tribal jurisdictions and service provider partners to implement a multidisciplinary, collaborative approach to combat all forms of human trafficking and dismantle criminal trafficking networks.

Objectives:

- Provide ongoing TTA (both remotely and onsite) to strengthen the ECM task force approach and build the capacity of existing and future site-based human trafficking task force grantees throughout the duration of their federal funding.
- Provide subject matter expertise on a range of current human trafficking policy, investigative techniques, and practice issues for both OJP grantees and nongrantees.
- Disseminate materials describing promising practices, organize and convene meetings and forums (as required by OJP), and evaluate and report findings for the benefit of the field.

Deliverables

1. Increased number of Task Force Liaisons (TFLs) and increased TFL hours engaged with assigned task forces.
2. Increased staffing time to support overall project coordination, TFL program, site assessments, and national subject matter convenings.
3. Travel to conduct site visits to newly funded task forces in Fiscal Year 2022, estimated at up to 14 sites.
4. Increased staffing and consultant time to support prosecution specific TA and peer to peer field coaching sessions.
5. Travel to support outreach, presentations, and facilitation for in person convenings and national and/or regional conferences.
6. Produce publication to inform the field on best practices for proactive investigative approaches.

Proposal Abstract

A project abstract (no more than 400 words) summarizing the proposed project including primary activities, products and deliverables, the service area, and who will benefit from the proposed project, will be completed in the JustGrants Web-based form.

Proposal Narrative

The program narrative should be submitted as an attachment in JustGrants. The attached document should be double-spaced, using a standard 12-point Times New Roman font; have no less than 1-inch margins; and should not exceed 15 pages. Pages should be numbered and submitted as an attachment. If the program narrative fails to comply with these length restrictions, OVC may negatively consider such noncompliance in final award decisions.

The following sections must be included as part of the program narrative:

- a. Description of the Issue OR Statement of the problem, if research is involved
Describe why this project is significant to facilitating access to service for crime victims in AI/AN communities.
- b. Project Design and Implementation
Describe the strategy to address the objectives and deliverables of the program. List the proposed program activities and describe how they relate to the stated objectives. Provide a timetable indicating when activities or program milestones are to be accomplished.
- c. Capabilities and Competencies
Describe the capabilities and competencies to accomplish the goals and objectives of the project.
- d. Plan for Collecting the Data Required for this Solicitation's Performance Measures
Describe the process for measuring project performance. Identify who will collect the data; who is responsible for performance measurements; and how the information will be used to guide and evaluate the impact of the project. Describe the process to accurately report data.

Note: applicants are **not** required to submit performance data with the application. Rather, performance measures information is included as an alert that successful applicants will be required to submit performance data as part of the reporting requirements under an award.

OJP will require each successful applicant to submit regular performance data that demonstrate the results of the work carried out under the award. The performance data directly relate to the goals, objectives, and deliverables identified under “Goals, Objectives, and Deliverables.”
