SUMMARY OF PROJECT ACTIVITIES

The project's proposed activities will include:

- 1) removal of the existing north shore fishing dock;
- 2) new construction of the north shore fishing dock

SELECTION JUSTIFICATION

The projected work on this proposal was not competed, as Contra Loma Regional Park operates through a Management Agreement between Reclamation and the East Bay Regional Park District (East Bay) (Contract No.14-LC-20-0470). The Agreement states that the "Administration, Operation, Maintenance, and Development of Recreation Uses and Facilities at Contra Loma Reservoir" will be administered by East Bay during the term of the Agreement. In September of 2014, Reclamation issued a Final Resource Management Plan (RMP)/Environmental Impact Statement. This document states that "Implementing the RMP management actions will be the primary responsibility of the managing partner." East Bay has

been the Managing Partner since 1972, with distinct, institutional and adequate background knowledge to continue their efforts in that capacity, by improving recreational park facilities, accessibility and safety requirements for the public.

Unique Qualifications – The applicant is uniquely qualified to perform the activity based upon a variety of demonstrable factors such as location, property ownership, voluntary support capacity, cost-sharing ability if applicable, technical expertise, or other such unique qualifications.
