OVERVIEW, RECIPIENT AND NPS SUBSTANTIAL INVOLVEMENT

The Organization of American Historians (OAH) will collaborate with the National Park Service (NPS) to: Conduct the necessary background research and survey(s) to complete the 2006-2007 draft nominations and a new Navajo Hill Mission 66 District nomination with the support of the NPS Cultural Landscapes program. The recipient will incorporate comments from park, regional, and WASO office staff along with those of the Colorado SHPO to complete the set of final nominations ready for listing on the NRHP. Current standards of the NPS NRHP program will be followed for photographs, mapping, and final nomination forms.

Substantial involvement on the part the National Park Service (NPS) is anticipated for the successful completion of the objectives to be funded by this award. NPS staff will assist with: The NPS will provide staff time to lead

surveys through the IMR cultural landscapes program. The NPS will provide sub-meter GPS survey support, GIS-based mapping support, and any required standards for labeling metadata or other files. The NPS will support the research needs of the recipient through providing access to park files, reports, photographs, maps, or any other documents needed during the project to help clarify the history, significance, and evolution of these landscapes.

NPS did not solicit full and open competition for this award based the following criteria:

The cooperator is a member of an established Cooperative Ecosystem Studies Unit (CESU) network, and was awarded a Cooperative Agreement (P16AC00031) allowing OAH to participate in specific tasks, and can provide the necessary activities involved in this particular task while providing an effective outcome for the National Park Service and the research and/or education project. This task agreement is a continuation of the Master Agreement.
