

Questions for BAA-GLOBAL HEALTH-2016 Addendum 3

ELIGIBILITY

- 1. Can our organization apply for/be awarded a Round 7 SL@B and this BAA Addendum, or is this considered a conflict of interest?**

Yes, an organization can apply for and be recipients of awards under both Addendum 03 and 04.

- 2. If our organization has already won a SL@B, are we eligible to apply for this BAA Addendum?**

Yes, your organization is eligible to apply.

TECHNICAL

- 3. What data are available on the effect of SL@B grants on health outcomes?**

As part of their reporting requirements, Saving Lives at Birth grants periodically report on health outcome, output, and relevant project-specific indicators. In most cases, health outcome data is reported by our transition-to-scale grantees.

REVIEW PROCESS

- 4. USAID has used multiple collaborative methods for program design. Will the final design of this Addendum involve a co-creation model with multiple partners? Will there be a design workshop?**

The final design may involve one award with multiple partners or multiple awards. It has not been decided yet. A design workshop involving short-listed applicants may be coordinated if the SL@B Partners determine an in-person workshop would be beneficial. If the Partners deem a combination/collaboration of individual applicants to be beneficial, they will reach out directly to these applicants.

AWARD MECHANISM

- 5. Has the type of contractual mechanism for the award been decided?**

No, the contractual mechanism(s) for the award(s) have not been decided.

BUDGET

- 6. What is the expected budget range for this BAA Addendum? Is there a known funding ceiling?**

There is not a pre-determined funding ceiling. We expect applicants to justify their proposed costs, including staff, consultants, travel, equipment, supplies, etc.

- 7. What are the possible budget categories or should we choose our line items?**

Generally, we would anticipate the budget to include line items for labor (both staff and consultants), travel/transportation, equipment, supplies, other direct costs, sub-awards, and any administrative (indirect) costs. Further breakdown of line items is encouraged, as are breakdowns of all costs by each partner organization involved in the program. A [budget template](#) has been added to the Saving Lives at Birth website for your convenience.

8. How long should the budget narrative be?

We would anticipate the budget narrative being at least two pages. There is no maximum page limit.

9. Are the budget pages included in the overall 3-page limit or separate?

Separate – there is no page limit to the budget and budget narrative.

DEVELOPMENT^xCHANGE

10. Approximately how many people attended past Development^xChange?

Approximately 200 innovators, SL@B partners, and other event participants (speakers, workshop hosts, etc.) attend the closed portions of the Development^xChange. We also open up portions of the event to the public, such as our signature Innovation Marketplace, which is attended by hundreds of people.

11. Approximately how many finalists are expected to be named at this year's Development^xChange?

In the past, about 50-60 finalists have been invited to the event.

12. Would the organizer be responsible for covering the travel costs of any of the ^xChange participants?

Travel costs for the finalists and a few selected guests are covered by the SL@B Partners. The organizer will be responsible for planning, organizing, and booking the travel and accommodations for each of these participants.
