for
NIST Public Safety Innovation Accelerator Program (PSIAP) –
Follow-on Funding for Technical and Business Assistance
and Demonstration Projects with Public Safety Agencies**

NIST is issuing this amendment (Amendment 3) to announce the closing date of this NOFO, advise applicants that the Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) replaces the DUNS number in the application, update the grant rules and regulations contact, and revise the applicable announcement text accordingly.

A final financial report is due within 120 days after the end of the project period.
