SUBJECT: Environmental Assessment and Finding of No Significant Impact under the National Environmental Policy Act – Notice of Funding Availability for Fiscal Year 2025:
Lead Hazard Reduction Grant Program FR-6900-N-13

It is the finding of this Office that the updated content of the subject Notice FR-6900-N-13 does not represent a substantive or significant change to the content of the previously published Notice FR-6800-N-13. As such, the following determination remains: the subject Notice does not constitute a major Federal action having an individually or cumulatively significant effect on the human environment and therefore does not require the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement.

The attached Notice sets out the guidance to govern the Lead Hazard Reduction Grant Program with Healthy Homes Supplemental funding, which is authorized by section 1011 of the Residential Lead- Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 (Title X of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1992) (42 U.S.C. 4852), and sections 501 and 502 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1970 (12 U.S.C. 1701z-1 and 1701z-2). Funding for this program is provided by the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 (Public Law 117-328, approved December 29, 2022), the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2024 (Public Law 118-42, approved March 9, 2024), and the Full-Year Continuing Appropriations and Extensions Act, 2025 (Public Law 119-4, approved March 15, 2025).

This brief Environmental Assessment and Finding of No Significant Impact provides verification that the attached Environmental Assessment and FONSI for FR-6800-13 remains applicable to this notice FR-6900-N-13.
